Shopping Tips for Tax Free Weekend

COLUMBIA, S.C. – The South Carolina Department of Consumer Affairs (SCDCA) is offering the following tips for consumers to get the best tax-free weekend experience.

- Consumers should review the list of tax-free items on the <u>Department of Revenue's</u>
 <u>website</u>. Making a list and sticking to it will help consumers stay on budget and avoid impulse purchases that are not tax-exempt.
- When shopping in store, choose cash if you have trouble sticking to a budget. If a
 consumer does not like to use cash or chooses to shop online, credit cards offer more
 consumer fraud protections. If using a credit card, pay the bill on time and in full to avoid
 interest.
- Avoid impulsively signing up for store credit cards. Interest rates on these cards are often high, costing more than they initially save.

There is one more tip that SCDCA Administrator Carri Grube Lybarker encourages consumers to employ, "Keep a watchful eye on your financial statements, especially after heavy use. Whether it's a fraudulent charge or simply an error on your statement, the longer you wait to address it, the harder it will be to get corrected."
