SPOTLIGHT: Charity Scams

KNOW WHO YOU ARE GIVING TO.

Don't let scammers profit off your generosity.



- **Be wary of requests for unusual forms of payment.** Do not make donations using prepaid debit cards, gift cards, wire or bank transfer. Once in the hands of a scam artist, the money is gone and difficult to trace.
- Don't give out personal information to someone soliciting a donation. Personal information can be as valuable as cash to a criminal, who may try to convince you to part with credit card or bank account data, phone numbers, addresses, and more.
- **Don't assume solicitations on social media or crowdfunding sites are legitimate.** Some scammers hijack links to legitimate sites while others may misappropriate donated funds.
- Be careful of charities that pressure you to donate quickly. Ask any cold-caller to send you information about the charity through the mail.

CHECK OUT CHARITIES BEFORE DONATING

- Scammers can create fake charities to trick people out of donations. Look out for charities with names that sound like famous charities but are not. Go to the SC Secretary of State's <u>website</u> to see if the charity is registered. You can also call 1 (888) 242-7484.
- Research charities online using words like "scam" and "complaint." You can also check a charity's ratings with the <u>BBB Wise Giving Alliance</u>, <u>Charity Navigator</u>, <u>Charity Watch</u>, and <u>Guidestar</u>.
- Use the IRS's Tax Exempt Organization Search to see if your donation is tax-deductible.

GENERAL TIPS

- **Donate to well-known charities.** Watch out for charities that have sprung up overnight. Do not assume a charity is legitimate based on its name. Some phony charities use names that sound or look like those of respected, legitimate organizations.
- Know where your money is going. Ask what percentage of your contribution goes to the cause. Find out their mission and history. Do not be afraid to ask for details in writing.
- **Do not give or send cash.** For security and tax record purposes, contribute by check or credit card. Write the official name of the charity on your check.

TO REPORT A SCAM

- Call the SC Secretary of State's Division of Public Charities at 1 (888) 242-7484.
- File a confidential complaint online with the SC Secretary of State using their <u>Charitable Solicitation Complaint</u> Form.
